

**Jenkins Centre Interventions Programme:
Information & Referral Criteria for Professionals**

Thank you for considering making a referral to the Jenkins Centre. We firmly believe in people's ability to change and in holding perpetrators of domestic abuse accountable for their behaviour whilst offering a space to help them with that path to healthier relationships. The Jenkins Centre provides an interventions programme for Adults using Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) either in a current or past relationship, and referrals are not accepted without details of the perpetrator and current and/or ex-partner.

Jenkins Centre Eligibility & Suitability Criteria	
Exclusions:	We are unable to work with any individuals that are current in criminal proceedings due to their use of violence against a current or former partner, or for an offence against a child. (Individuals in criminal proceedings for other types of offences could be eligible, please make us aware of these when making a referral or call us to discuss.)
	Any individuals who are in private law proceedings related to child custody or child contact are not eligible to begin engaging with The Jenkins Centre until these proceedings are complete.
	Where Children's Services are involved with a family and are the case is entering proceedings related to custody of a child, we would not be able to work with the family. If the case is likely to enter proceedings, please contact us before making a referral.
	If you are referring someone who has previously disengaged from our service, or a similar service then we would ask for at least a 6-month break from when they disengaged. They will also need to demonstrate why they are now able to commit to the programme.
Please note, if a referral is accepted from Children's Services, it is essential that the case is kept open whilst we complete our assessment.

Submitting Referrals & Advice Prior to Referrals

The Jenkins Centre Referral Form **must** be submitted electronically through the organisations email system via one of the email addresses below. Support in relation to completion of a referral can be accessed via the Jenkins Centre (0116 2540101). Documents can be password protected. Passwords should be sent separately. Faxed referrals are not accepted. Once we have received your referral, we will send confirmation of receipt and referral processing shall commence. Self-referrals are accepted, however where a client is open to the local authority or another agency the referral must come from this agency. Where clients self-refer and are open to CYPS or other statutory agency, we will decline the referral and request that an agency referral is made.

Referral Processing Procedure

Processing the referral involves checking the referral form for client eligibility and ensuring all the information requested is present. If referral forms are incomplete, they will be returned to the referrer.

Perpetrator Contact	Victim/survivor contact
<p>Perpetrator will be contacted within 5 working days of referral being received to discuss the referral, explain the programme and discuss an assessment appointment.</p> <p>Three contact attempts will be made to the perpetrator regarding an assessment appointment before closing the client; no more than 7 working days will be left between the three contact attempts. If we are unable to make contact, the referrer and victim will be advised of this, and we will close the case.</p>	<p>Contacted within 48 hours of details being received. Initial support needs are established, the programme and support offer is explained. Partners/ex-partners are eligible for long-term support from a partner support worker (PSW) once the perpetrator has started intervention. This support is optional, but is encouraged and pro-active contact is made by the PSW.</p>
<p>Perpetrator attends assessment appointment; client is assessed as suitable or not suitable for the programme.</p> <p>If the perpetrator is not suitable the referrer and the perpetrator will be notified of this decision and the reasons for it.</p> <p>Assessment appointments are offered within 4 weeks of receiving the referral unless there are circumstances that make this not possible.</p>	<p>Partner is advised of the outcome of the assessment. If the perpetrator is not-suitable further support needs are explored and referrals are made, if required, before closing.</p>
<p>Perpetrator starts Interventions; referrer is advised of the start date and engagement. If the perpetrator fails to engage 3 further contacts are made to re-engage the client. Each contact made is no more than 7 days apart. If none of the contacts made are successful, the case will be closed.</p>	<p>Partner and/or ex-partner becomes eligible for long term support from a PSW.</p>

About the Programmes

Our 24 week programme is broken down into two modules which incorporate additional midway one to one sessions and support. Both of these modules are mandatory when engaging with The Jenkins Centre, it is not possible to refer someone to complete just one module.

Safer Relationships Programme: (12 Weeks)

The first twelve sessions of the interventions programme focus on safer relationships. These sessions focus on topics and themes such as the build-up to abuse, triggers and warning signs, and the impact on partners, children and those around us.

Respectful Relationships Programme: (12 Weeks)

The final twelve sessions of the interventions programme focus on respectful relationships. These sessions focus on topics and themes such as jealousy, accountability, boundaries and healthy communication.

Dads Programme: (10 Weeks)

This programme is for men that have completed our group interventions programme. The programme is a CBT based programme looking at fathering after being abusive in a relationship, and goes into the impact of abuse on children (direct and indirect) and establishing a better relationship with children. The programme additionally explores the group members own experiences of being fathered, and how to communicate appropriately with all ages of children regarding use of abuse.

One-to-one Interventions Programmes

one-to-one Interventions Programmes can be delivered in particular cases. These include:

- Working with female perpetrators/ women using violence
- Working with people in same-sex relationships
- Working with individuals requiring an interpreter (It is the responsibility of the agency referring the individuals to provide an interpreter to attend the sessions with the individual.)
- Working with individuals with complex needs who would not be able to engage with a group intervention (This will be determined by us at an assessment stage based on need and referrers should not tell people they can do the programme individually or to ask for this)
- Clients between the age of 18 and 21

Unfortunately, we have limited capacity to complete one-to-one work and waiting lists for this can be long, therefore clients wishing to engage in one-to-one work outside of the above criteria are assessed on a case-by-case basis. Where possible, we encourage clients to attend our group programme.
